Towers, Ramparts & Curtain Walls	Walk the walls once used by bowmen and archers. Climb to the top of Guy's Tower and follow the ramparts to the upper levels of the Gatehouse. Continuing along the walls, visit the tallest tower; Caesar's Tower on the southern side. Set in the north walls, stunted Clarence and Bear Towers were once home to the Royal Keep and bears.	35 mins	Primary & Secondary
The Conqueror's Fortress	Take a short but steep ascent to the top of the oldest part of Warwick Castle. First built in 1068 under the orders of William the Conqueror, it formed the most important part of the castle's defence system and was a symbol of power and authority.	25 mins	All ages
Horrible Histories® Maze	You'll face fun challenges as your group unravels history in the world's first Horrible Histories® adventure maze. This walk-through experience combines obstacles and minor motion movements.	30 mins	Primary
Zog and The Quest for the Golden Star	This activity trail takes place around the castle estate and is available everyday until 5 th September 2021. Children can take part in 5 individual interactive activities.	45 mins	Early Years

Gatehouse & Barbican	Housing the portcullis and constructed to defend the castle from foreign armies, the Barbican is an exterior walled and cobbled passage, which leads to the main entrance known as the Gatehouse.	5 mins	All ages
Peacock Gardens	Dating back to the Elizabethan era, one of the most iconic elements of Warwick Castle is its stunning gardens, complete with roaming peacocks.	10 mins	All ages
Pageant Field	Our sweeping views down to the River Avon were designed by none other than Lancelot 'Capability' Brown, one of Britain's greatest landscape gardeners.	10 mins	All ages

Name	Description	Time	Great For...
The Great Hall	In the early Middle Ages it was here that noblemen ate, drank and slept. Embellished over time, today the Great Hall is home to an impressive armoury and historic weapons collection.	15 mins	All ages
Staterooms	Representing the character of the castle in the 17th and 18th centuries, the Staterooms once provided the most lavish interiors; in which to entertain guests and showcase the family's most prestigious possessions.	15 mins	Primary & Secondary
Royal Weekend Party	Experience Victorian high society. Waxwork figures depict Warwick Castle's role during the 1890s as a hub for entertaining and hosting some of the most influential figures.	20 mins	All ages
The Kingmaker	Experience the sights, sounds and smells of medieval England alongside Richard Neville, commonly known as 'Warwick the Kingmaker' as he prepares his army for battle.	25 mins	Primary & Secondary
Mill & Engine House	For nearly 600 years the Mill used the power of the River Avon to grind grain. In the 19th Century the hydropower was harnessed by the Engine House to generate electricity for the castle.	15 mins	Primary & Secondary
